1. Building will be open to receive exhibits at 8:00 a.m. Thursday.
2. All entries must be labeled and in place by 12:00 Noon, Thursday and must remain on display until 9:00 p.m. Saturday. Items picked up before release time will forfeit ribbons and premium money.
3. Building will be closed from 1:00 to 5:00 p.m. Thursday for judging exhibits.
4. All exhibits will be available for viewing by the public at 5:00 p.m. Thursday.
5. Premium checks should be picked up at release time from the overall superintendent. No checks will be mailed.
6. Indoor exhibits must be picked up by 10:00 a.m. on Monday. The Fair is not responsible for items left after that time.
7. Exhibitors may enter any number of entries in a particular class but may collect placing money on only one exhibit per class.
8. All exhibits entered must be the property of and made by the exhibitor. No commercial entries allowed.
9. The fair reserves the right to reject any entry they feel unworthy of exhibition.
10. Personnel will be available at all times to answer questions and furnish information.
11. Anyone living in McDonald, Newton, or Barry Counties is eligible to exhibit articles in the McDonald County Fair. See general rules and regulations.
12. Premiums will be awarded in Children, Youth, and High School Divisions only:  
1st - \$5.00, 2nd - \$4.00, 3rd - \$3.00, unless otherwise stated.
13. Only articles that have never been exhibited before in the McDonald County Fair will be accepted for entry.
14. The age divisions are as follows for all indoor exhibits, excluding the 4-H Division:  
Children - 8 years and younger  
Youth - 9-13 years  
High School I- 14-18 years  
Adult - 19 years and older

Exhibit the following amounts: Three (3) cookies, biscuits, rolls, ginger bread, cornbread, etc., for display and 1 more wrapped separate for judges; 1/2 loaf bread, 1/2 cake, or 1/2 pie, and one slice wrapped separate for judges; whole decorated cakes and whole crusts. Cakes judged for decorating will not be cut. Exhibit one (1) jar of any canned fruit, vegetable, pickles, relishes, etc. Label with processing method and time processed. Any baked or preserved foods may be opened, if necessary, for judging. No food will be sold. A plaque will be awarded to the best professionally decorated cake.
